We have had a busy summer so far. Lots of events and adoptions. Last year we had adopted out 506 cats and kittens for the entire year, looks like we are on schedule to pass that amount for this year. We are only able to do that because of **YOU** and your support with your time, talents and finances. Thank you for helping so many kitties.



Adoptions

From January 1 to July 16, we placed 327 cats and kittens. We continue to get busier and busier. Yes we have been adopting out a record number of cats and kittens, but keep in mind that it has never been about reaching higher numbers for us. We will take in as many cats as we can responsibly take care of and we look to have these cats go to their perfect home. We will fully disclose what we know about each cat and try to find a good fit during the adoption process. We don't want the cats to be returned, it is very disruptive to them. It is important for both cats and guardians to be happy with the situation.

"If dogs charm us with their transparent desires, then perhaps cats are beloved because they're so mysterious. Why do they do the odd and sometimes aggravating things they do? And how can they be so adorable while getting up to such mischief?"

The second question is easy. It's because cats are really, really cute. With 4,500 cats licensed in Clark County, that's a lot of kitty cuteness — and a lot of potentially baffling behavior. Vancouver cat behavior expert Marci Koski spends her days helping "cat guardians" (as Koski prefers to say) understand just what's going on inside their felines' furry little heads.

"When a cat has behavior issues, that cat is really saying, 'Something is wrong in my environment. My needs are not getting met,' " said Koski, owner of <u>Feline Behavior Solutions</u>. "All I do is work with people to help them better understand the cat's needs."

Furry Friends Rescues Cats from hoarding situations

In 2023 Furry Friends has dived paws-first into hoarding cases and has made a life-saving difference for hundreds of kitties' lives. From Jan-July we have taken in 114 cats and kittens from only FOUR separate hoarding situations. These felines have ranged in ages from newborns up to 12 years old with a range of medical conditions. These medical conditions include: Upper respiratory infections, giardia, ringworm, coccidia, panleukopenia, hernias, malnutrition and diarrhea, calici virus, ear mites, fleas, anemia, pneumonia, and, of course, not being altered. Just the bare minimum medical care, shelter, and feeding costs over \$57,000 to take care of these kitties.

This does not include any of the medical care needed above the normal that we do for every cat and kitten in our care. Three kittens out of the 114 we took in did not make it. Their sickness was unfortunately too far advanced and they could not be saved. We were too late for 3 but saved 111, how many more are we too late for? We only take on as many as we can financially, emotionally, and physically handle and in reality the cat and kitten population is beyond us, alone. That is why we need you! These cats and kittens did not need to be in this situation. This is a direct result of not spaying and neutering! Help us help these cats and kittens that have no voice and no choice on how they live. Help us be their voice!

The in-person 'HISS' auction is our biggest fundraiser of the year. We are supported only by our sponsors, donors and some small grants. We get no funding from the city, state or other organization. Our yearly budget is about \$350,000.

Spay/Neuter Supplies

Did you know Furry friends partners with another Shelter for spay neuter services. Our own Executive Director, Jenn, volunteers one or two days every week at this clinic! They go through alot of med supplies there, as you can imagine. If you would like to help this clinic (and Furry friends kitties who go there) check out our Amazon wishlist! This one-of-a kind Welch Cabin is 90 feet above the fabled 'Holy Waters' of the unique Kalama River and sits on 19 acres of preserved forest. There is easy access to the gin-clear river. For over 20 years The Cabin was 'off the grid'. In 2022 renovations were made that retain the wilderness aspects but add important modern conveniences; processed water from our creek, 'his' and 'her' Bio-Toilets along with hot showers, WI-FI and a modern kitchen. The Welch Cabin is accessible by the paved and winding Kalama River Road, just 10 miles from the town of Kalama WA. This property is in a full conservation easement and while no neighbors are within sight, other homes are less than a mile away.

Amenities offered: fireplace, coffee/tea makers. sofa beds and dining table, refrigerator, gas stove, cookware/dishes/utensils. Outdoor bathrooms include bio toilet and a shower with hot water.
