Adoptions

We are off to a brisk start for 2023. From January 1 to 17 we have already adopted 37 cats and kittens. Wow! That has kept us busy, for sure. Rosie, who was with us for over a year, was one of those adopted. She came to us in a lot of pain. She had been declawed by her previous owner and it was a botched job with her toe bones breaking through the skin. She also had severe ear issues that required surgeries. Resolving her medical problems and improving her health and well-being took quite a while. She is now a happy kitty living a good life in her new home. Stories like Rosie's mean the world to us. We just wish we could rescue more cats and give them a healthy, happy life. It takes a village to make Furry Friends successful, and we are so appreciative of everyone who puts in their time, talents, and finances to help us and for the adopters that give the kitties a good home.



Here is what you get when you adopt a cat or kitten from Furry Friends.

The medical care given to all our cats costs Furry Friends anywhere from \$421 on the low end to \$813 on the high end, and that's just for the medical basics! This cost does not reflect any of their food or litter expenses, nor the cost for any extra medical treatments received on a case by case basis. When you adopt a cat through Furry Friends you get the peace of mind knowing that you receive the kitty in good health and that they should not need any additional medical attention until their annuals are due.

Adoption Fee Increase


Due to the rising costs of care, we are updating our adoption fees to the following: \$180 for kittens (up to 1yr) with a discount on a 2nd kitten \$100 for adult cats
\$75 for senior cats (10yrs +)

We are taking in more cats and adopting more than we ever have, and these hours reflect that. We are still a volunteer-run organization, with only one full-time employee and two part-time employees. It takes a village, we could not exist if it was not for our volunteers.



Volunteer Spotlight: Lorien Kelly

A true animal lover, Lorien Kelly owns five cats and fosters others as needed, and she has a "little back patio sanctuary" where she feeds a family of raccoons and a pair of opossums.

Lorien became involved with Furry Friends in April 2018 while she was caring for an injured stray that showed up one day on her patio.

"I was so impressed with the organization and fell in love with the Halfway House," she said. "I just knew I needed to start volunteering."

And what a volunteer! She has been the Saturday morning shift lead for nearly four years; she fosters fragile medical kitties, and she helps with transportation. She averages about 17 hours a week at the Halfway House.

The purpose of this auction is to bring attention to Kitten Season. Springtime is when love is in the air, and we start to see "kitten season" kick into full swing. We anticipate performing over 350 spay/neuters this year to help control the cat population in our community. The funds from this online auction will go toward the more than \$25,000 cost of spay/neuter services Furry Friends projects and will help to cover extraordinary medical expenses for cats that need that extra TLC to get them into a loving home.

Thank you for all your help supporting the kitties. Every little bit helps. We spend about \$350,000 a year to take care of the kitties and we need to constantly fundraise to pay for their needs.



Furry Friends adopted out 506 cats and kittens for 2022, a record number for the shelter. Pictured is the 500th adoption, which was to Dr. Reading and her family, Craig and Anna. Dr. Reading is with Horizon Veterinary Care, a new practice that just opened in east Vancouver at 1900 NE 162nd Ave Suite D110, Vancouver WA 98684,

They adopted Carlos (the kitty) who was dumped out in the country and brought to Furry Friends for help. After he was medically ready he captured the hearts of the entire family. He sure is a lucky kitty! Furry Friends is excited to have the opportunity to work with Horizon Veterinary Care in addition to our other very valuable Vet Care relationships.



WOW! Another record number of adoptions! We were able to adopt out **506 cats and kittens for 2022** bringing our total number of adoptions up to 4,254 since we began in 1999.

We are so appreciative of everyone who has put in their times, skills, finances and support to make this happen.



Giving cats and kittens away can lead to sad consequences

If you find yourself with a cat or kittens that you don't want, please do not put an ad in Craig's List or other publication to give them away for free. In many cases these felines are used as dog fighting bait, or lab animals, or people will take them and not care for them. Or maybe you do give them to a

responsible person for free and then they find out they will be spending over \$500 to take care of their spay/neuter operation, vaccinations and other basic medical care.

It is better to see if a shelter can take them. Furry Friends is not a large shelter but we will take in as many cats and kittens as we can responsibly care for.

We are dealing with two hoarding situations right now. In the first case, the people never bothered to get their cats fixed, and soon 30 cats were living in their home. We have taken 18 of those cats so far. The second situation involved a person who took in any free cat or kitten they found on Craig's list or from other publications. We have taken on 11 cats and kittens from that situation. They were being starved to death and a couple of them had their eyes crusted shut, plus they had many other medical problems. A couple of the kittens may not make it. We will do all that we can to get these babies healthy and then find good homes for them.



While your cat is outside it more than likely will come across other animals that might carry diseases, some fatal. The most common are FIV, FeLV, FIP, FP, and URI's. Not to mention they can pick up fleas, worms, mites, and other parasites. So, what in the world do all these letters mean??

FIV – <u>Feline Immunodeficiency Virus</u> affects up to 4.4% of cats and is spread by deep bite wounds. FIV attacks their immune system leaving them susceptible to all other viruses and bacteria. There are no vaccines and no cure for this disease.

FeLV – <u>Feline Leukemia Virus</u> is spread through infected saliva or nasal secretions. In the past this was a death sentence but now we are learning more about it cats can live a fairly normal life with the disease as long as they have proper care.
