CHOW: Pet Food Assistance

Those who are on government assistance of any kind are qualified to receive pet food assistance though the Humane Society for Southwest Washington's CHOW program. Families receive one month's supply of food, per household, per month. Animals are required to be spayed or neutered, and owners must agree to not acquire new pets while using the program. Proof of government assistance as well as spay and neuter paperwork are required to qualify. 360-213-2621

The program provides relief for families facing a temporary hardship or displacement due to domestic violence, emergency medical issues and other urgent needs that prevent them from caring for their pet.
