We have adopted out a record number of cats and kittens for 2023. From January 1 to June 15, we placed 269 cats and kittens. If we keep going like this we will pass our 506 adoptions record from last year.



Spotlight on Kate Goudschaal

Kate Goudschaal has become an expert in caring for newborns—newborn kittens, that is. In her 15 years of fostering, she has volunteered for various animal rescue organizations, including Furry Friends, which she joined more than two years ago.

When she moved back to Vancouver from Multnomah County in 2021, "I was surprised and happy to find Furry Friends right in my backyard and was immediately impressed with their philosophy and approach to cat care and rescue."

Kate is one of the few volunteers to take on neonates or bottle babies. She said the first kittens that she accepted were only four days old. When she's caring for a litter, she's available 24-7, although the actual number of hours will depend on the health and age of the kittens. "Fostering is typically a 'round the clock' assignment, but it is so very rewarding," she said.

Fortunately there are various ways to deal with your kitty's paw-tential distress both before and after the fireworks have begun.

Keep your cat indoors on the day of the fireworks -- especially those allowed outside for brief periods of time. Since she may attempt to slip outside or even bolt in terror because of the flashes and sounds, take extra care when opening and closing all exterior doors. But if the unthinkable happens and she does escape, for your peace of mind and her ultimate safety, have her micro-chipped.

JULY IS NATIONAL LOST PET PREVENTION MONTH

Not surprisingly, July 4 and the days surrounding it are the busiest days of the year for animal shelters accepting lost pets. As we noted above, fireworks during celebrations by pet owners can be a little upsetting for the four-legged members of the family. Many dogs and cats, startled and frightened by the sounds of fireworks or the activity of backyard parties, flee and get lost.

Aside from the events, many families enjoy vacations over the summer. Pets who join their owners on vacation are in danger of being disoriented in a new environment. Those that are left behind may flee due to loneliness or distress. Unfortunately, less than 3% of lost pets who wind up in shelters find their way home, and only 17% of dogs find their way home. One of the best ways you can protect your pet is by getting them microchipped.



A beautiful Siamese boy was brought to Furry Friends after a family noticed him hanging out in their yard. They started offering him food, and called him Panther. He seemed a little thin. so they assumed he was a stray kitty and contacted Furry Friends to take him in. During his intake checkup, it was discovered that Panther was microchipped, and his name was actually Vladimir! We were able to contact his owner, and as it turns out, Vlad lives next door to the family who found him and he had just strayed a little farther out of his yard than usual. His owner said Vlad had been gone just a few days, and she had been worried sick about him. We also learned that Vladimir is 14 years old and has some known medical issues that explained his weight. He was able to be reunited with his owner after less than 24 hours of being brought to the shelter!
