Volunteer Spotlight: Betsy Sanford


Nothing gives Betsy Sanford more joy than getting to know the cats who live at the Furry Friends house and giving them "cuddles and a little fun."

defect which left her with no hip socket to connect her hip. Rosie's hip defect may require surgery to correct, but she will need to grow a little first. Thank you to everyone who donated their time and items for the Spring We Can Move Meow-tains online auction. It was a great success, the auction brought in \$23,000 for the kitties. The purpose of the spring auction was to bring attention to Kitten Season. Springtime is when love is in the air, and we start to see "kitten season" kick into full swing. We anticipate performing over 400 spay/neuters this year to help control the cat population in our community. The funds from this online auction will go toward the more than \$50,000 cost of spay/neuter services Furry Friends projects and will help to cover extraordinary medical expenses for cats that need that extra TLC to get them into a loving home.



Our table had a lot of attention at the **Blossom Blast Bazaar**. We sold \$140 worth of Furry Friends merchandise and attracted quite a few people who want to adopt cats. Furry Friends honors volunteers

The nonprofit cat-rescue shelter Furry Friends is recognizing the vital role of its volunteers during National Volunteer Week April 16-22.

"There are not enough words to describe how amazed and grateful Furry Friends is for the dedication, compassion and generosity of the over 150 individuals who have given of themselves to Furry Friends," says Furry Friends President Jaimie Garver.

"Furry Friends would not be possible without the donation of funds, talent and time from our volunteers, who have seen the plight of the cats and kittens in our care. Our dedicated and compassionate volunteers have decided to not only talk the talk but also walk the walk and give of themselves in a most precious way: their time."

Volunteers donated close to 41,000 hours to the Clark County organization last year. In a tribute to them, Garver wrote of their impact on Furry Friends and the community:

- Shy/scared cats have learned to trust again and get into homes, like Moomoo, Hunter and Popeye.
- Cats that may have been deemed "barn cats" elsewhere have been socialized and can sleep in real beds — like Gus, King and Bernie.
- FIV cats get into homes that love them — like Ulysses and Bruce.
- The community is being educated about FIV and how scary it's not.

- Injured cats are getting the medical care they need and deserve—like Fluffy, Blue and Raggedy Andy
- Furry Friends cats are not only fed, but loved while they are with us.
- We have more than doubled the amount of cats we can help within the past two years.
- The community supports our efforts and it shows in donations, shares, likes and referrals.
- Many cats no longer have to have litter after litter of kittens — like Olive Oil. No more babies having babies!
- We educate owners in hoarding situations and help cats like Gee and Cheeks.
- We can expand our programs and services to meet the most vital needs within our community, like the pet pantry.
- We can provide hundreds of pounds of food to people who have temporary needs to keep cats in their homes.
- We can save the cats that most others wouldn't — like Raggedy Andy and Linus.
- Lonely people now have pet companions.
- Sassy cats that would sit in other places for years get into the perfect




