October, the adoption event month, proved unusually successful as we adopted out 61 cats and kittens in one month. I don't think we have ever done so many adoptions in such a short period of time. The events paid off for kitties who needed--and found--forever homes.



Adoptions

From January 1 to October 16, we placed 539 cats and kittens. We continue to get busier and busier. We are on track for adopting more than 600 cats and kittens this year. One of the cats recently adopted is Neptune. November is Adopt a Senior Pet Month

Older pets have the hardest time finding homes. It's a sad reality that these great animals are often the last to be adopted from shelters. November is Adopt-a-Senior-Pet Month and we hope, with your help, to improve the adoption rate for older pets by spreading awareness about how great senior pets can be.

The numerous reasons that make older pets a great option for families:

Calm, Cool, and Collected

Older pets are typically calmer than puppies and kittens, often content with a more relaxing day-to today routine. As we all know, puppies and kittens, though fun and entertaining, are often more rambunctious and may get into mischief when they get bored.

Family Friendly

The low-key, mellow nature of older pets makes them a great fit for households with children. Before ending up in shelters, senior pets often come from some sort of family life which makes adjusting to a new home environment much easier than it could be for puppies or kittens.





Volunteer Spotlight: Megan Faber

As a Monday evening shift worker, Megan has volunteered for Furry Friends since March 2023, and although she generally spends two to three hours a week at the shelter, she subs regularly and is often here multiple times a week.

She always comes in a few minutes early to get acquainted with and greet the cats, then meets with the shift lead and the rest of the team to prepare for the evening ahead. Once assigned a section, she gathers up all of the cats' dirty dishes, logs their food intake on their charts and brings the dishes to the kitchen. Then she cleans litter boxes, removes dirty blankets and beds and replaces dirty floor mats and food dishes before socializing with the cats – and, most importantly, taking videos to post for the group.



10 Tips for a Safe Thanksgiving



- Whether you're hosting guests or traveling, check that your pet is wearing a collar and tag with your current contact information.
- Update your pet's microchip. If your pet isn't microchipped, call your local shelter or veterinarian to make an appointment today!
- If you're leaving town without your pet, use a good pet sitter or boarding facility. Don't leave pets alone for days – water bowls can spill and accidents can happen.
- Explain to guests to be careful at doors. If you
 pet is a door dasher, keep him in another room
 while guests are coming in and out.
- 5. Make sure your pet gets his regular exercise and playtime whether with you or a pet sitter.
- Keep toys and treats at hand when hosting guests to distract pets and reward good behavior
- 7. Supervise all interactions between pets and kids for everyone's safety.
- 8. If you're hosting Thanksgiving guests, remind them not to feed your pet table scraps.
- Have a counter-surfing pet? Ask a reliable guest to keep your pet occupied in another room during the cooking.
- 10. After the meal, remove all trash and bones immediately. Curious pets can cause themselves serious harm chewing on sharp bones!
