

What is Furry Friends About?

WHO WE ARE

Furry Friends is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit no-kill cat rescue serving Clark County, Washington and adjacent counties. Founded in 1999, we are an all-volunteer organization that rescues and adopts out homeless, relinquished, and abused cats. We shelter and care for them as long as it takes to find them forever homes. We provide medical exams, medications, spay/neuter, food, and litter for up to 200 cats each year.

We currently average 175 adoptions per year, with over 2,529 adoptions during our two decades of operation. Without our help, and the help of our supporters, many of these cats would have been euthanized, left on the streets to fend for themselves, or continued to overpopulate the community with kittens.

Furry Friends has more than 150 community volunteers who come from diverse backgrounds to contribute their time, skills, and talents for the cats. There are also seven active volunteer board members and no paid staff. In 2017, our volunteers donated a record 25,000 hours, making it the largest number of volunteer hours recorded in the history of the organization. The volunteer hours in 2018 will surpass that number.

OUR MISSION

The Mission of Furry Friends is to help homeless, relinquished and abused cats by:

- Spaying or neutering.
- Providing medical care and foster homes until permanent placement of these cats into safe, nurturing homes.
- Educating the public regarding the care and responsibility of cat ownership.
- Collaborating with other pet rescue and companion groups to accomplish a no-kill status in the State of Washington.
- Offering senior visits/pet therapy to persons in nursing and assisted living facilities.

HOUSING THE CATS

We regularly house around 25 adult cats in our Vancouver shelter, which we lovingly refer to as our Halfway House. We don't disclose the physical location of the shelter to the general public, because we aren't large enough to take in unwanted cats that might be left on our doorstep. Members of the public interested in adopting one of our cats can either call our message line or submit an online request to meet at the Halfway House. Because our adoption team has flexible hours, the public can usually meet the cat within a few hours.

We rotate up to four cats at the PetSmart Hazel Dell Adoption Center during the week, where they are available for viewing and where we host adoption events for the public. We also provide care and supplies for approximately 10 unadoptable senior and medically-ill cats that we have placed in permanent foster homes. Kittens are always cared for in temporary foster homes, because their health tends to be fragile and because it's important that they're socialized and taught to use a litter box. The kittens can be preadopted, but they don't go to their new home without the required immunizations and being spayed or neutered.

Every cat taken in by Furry Friends has a 20-30 minute health check performed by our volunteer licensed veterinary technician. This includes blood tests for FIV/FeLV, vaccinations, treatment for fleas/mites/worms, microchipping, and necessary medications. Our veterinary partners give rabies shots, perform spay/neuter, and provide nonroutine procedures (e.g., dental work, X-rays, scans).

Our Goals

- Strengthen our volunteer base to increase the number of cats we are able to take in, adopt out and place in foster care.
- Complete an 11-space parking lot, and install a sidewalk which is required by the City of Vancouver by the summer of 2019. (The estimated cost of these two projects is expected to total \$100,000, which we have raised and earmarked for the two projects.)
- Secure financing to pay the salary of a halftime shelter manager.
- Secure financing to pay the salary of a halftime licensed veterinary technician.
- Pay off the \$140,000 mortgage on the Halfway House, which we purchased for the cats in 2016.
- Expand the Halfway House within the next five years to save more cats.

How We Are Funded

Furry Friends depends entirely on private donations, business sponsorships, fundraising events, and grants to finance an annual operating budget of approximately \$121,000. Our major fundraising event is our dinner and auction, held each September, which hosts more than 180 guests. In 2019, we will be celebrating our 20th year as a rescue and will be holding the dinner and auction at the upscale Heathman Lodge.

How We Allocate Funds

As a no-kill cat shelter, we spend a large portion of our budget on medical care (e.g., spay/neuter, checkups, surgeries, medication). In 2017, we spent \$65,606, 54% of our budget, on medical expenses for approximately 200 cats. In the first 10 months of 2018, we surpassed that amount by spending \$76,997 on medical care. This increase is due to the rising costs of veterinary procedures and because we are taking care of more and more cats each year.



How we give back to the community

Education. We publish cat education stories for the public as a way of educating them about the best ways to care for their own cats and the feral cats in our community. We posted 159 stories on our blog on The Columbian Newspaper's website from November 2015 through December 6, 2018. Cat Tales is written by award winning writer and Furry Friends volunteer Nomi Berger. The blog has had 35,565 views since its inception.

Pet Therapy Program. Volunteers take their own cat or dog once or twice a month to one of the local care facilities to visit the residents. The residents look forward to these visits. It gives them a chance to speak with our volunteers and reminisce about the beloved pets they had in the past.

Peace of Mind. Many of the cats we take in are from the elderly, who move into assisted living and can't take their cat with them. Other cats are relinquished by people who have fallen on hard times or by those in the military who are deployed to another country. These situations are stressful for the cat owner, especially when many of them have had the cat since it was a kitten and consider it a family member. They have peace of mind when they find out about our good reputation, how we love the cats, and how careful we are at placing them in the right forever home.

Emotional Support. Some of our volunteers have anxiety or medical issues. Their health and wellbeing are much improved when they are around the cats; taking care of the cats makes them feel they have a purpose in life. Because we are a no-kill shelter, we care for cats with digestive disorders, thyroid and obesity issues, diabetes, and other medical issues. Often volunteers have one or more of these issues and while helping the cats, they are also helping themselves.





Students. Twice a week, special needs students from the local Gate Program spend two hours at our Halfway House socializing the cats and assisting adult volunteers with cleaning. This opportunity is not only advantageous for Furry Friends, it teaches the students responsibly and how to behave appropriately around animals and people.

Low Cost ID Microchipping. Twice a year we offer discounted ID microchipping to the community. We charge \$20 per dog or cat, which is a savings of more than \$60 per pet. The microchips give lost pets a better chance of getting home safely.

Pet-Less Residents. Many of our volunteers are pet less due to their living conditions or low economic status. Being able to interact with the shelter cats gives them the “fix” that they are unable to achieve otherwise.

Feral Cat Colonies. We schedule volunteers to feed and care for colonies located in Vancouver area. We provide food and will transport feral cats in need of neutering to the Feral Cat Collision of Oregon (FCCO) and return them to their colonies.

Our Challenges

Limited room in isolation

Each cat that we take in stays in the isolation/medical room at the Halfway House for one to two weeks to ensure they are free of transmittable diseases that might spread to the general population. Once these cats are cleared, we can take in new cats. The isolation room is large enough for our medical equipment and to house three kitty condos that hold up to seven cats. We always have a wait list of cats that are ready to be taken in, and the sooner a new cat is released into the general population the sooner we can bring in more cats.

Upper respiratory disease is highly contagious and is fairly common. If we have a cat in isolation that has this disease, then all cats in isolation have to be treated for three weeks of daily medication to overcome it. But while this kitty is in isolation, we cannot take in any other cats. The ideal situation would be to have a couple of fully enclosed areas for infectious cats, and then more enclosures for cats just going through their routine one or two weeks in quarantine before they enter the general population of cats. As we save more money, it will be a priority to expand the medical/isolation area.



Our Halfway House

On August 5, 2016 we purchased our first house after 17 years of renting a facility. Our house was built in 1951, and it has 1,662 sq feet of space on over $\frac{1}{2}$ acre of land (.62 acre).

We do not publicize the address of our building. Visiting the shelter is by appointment only. We do not have people to staff the house so we cannot have people showing up without an appointment.
